

Suggestions Sought on Best Community Use for Belle Vue Building

aving been offered a town centre building as a community asset and to avoid it being sold off into private hands by Cornwall Council the Saltash Gateway Community Interest Company is eagerly seeking suggestions as to how it could be best used to benefit the town?

The premises at 18 Belle Vue Road have long been home to the Citizens Advice Bureau. The CAB were deeply concerned at the likelihood of having to move out when Cornwall Council proposed the sale of the building as part of its large scale selling of council property.

However after prolonged negotiations Cornwall Council has agreed to pass the premises to the CIC for two years rent free, allowing the CIC to test out whether they can make the building financially viable and of benefit to the town.

One immediate benefit will be that the much-used Citizens Advice Bureau can remain where it is. Now local organisations and individuals are invited to suggest how the rest of the building can be best used.

Ideas put forward already are as a centre for care, health and wellbeing, or hosting any local volunteer organisations working for the good of the community. It could also be used for developing the new

local businesses international trade is one of the ways in which South West businesses can be encouraged to expand.

Small businesses can be signposted to support on a wide range of topics via the Growth Hub which works in partnership with a number of business support agencies. There is a wide range of expert advice facilities, services and support packages to which small businesses can be referred and Mr. Hartop advised that 250 businesses across three counties had started up with new business ideas, a £3 million grant scheme and produced five hundred jobs. Investment in improving the skills and

confidence of young people to better equip them for the world of work had helped pilot 750 young people into business careers. while a youth mentor scheme helped 121 into work.

A particular concern of South East Cornwall businesses represented in their combined Chamber of Commerce and Industry is encouraging prospective customers and investors into the area. It was suggested that as many business people as possible representing each South East Cornish town should write to the Highways department and reaffirm that the quickest, fastest route to South East Cornwall from Exeter and beyond is down the A38 and over the Tamar Bridge It is misleading to offer only the A30 via Bodmin as the way to Cornwall and adds pressure and congestion to that route. There have been complaints that people misled by signage at the end of the motorway have gone to Bodmin and been forced to back track down the winding Glynn Valley route to reach South East Cornwall towns

Letter to the Editor

If Cornwall's Councillors were in any doubt at all over the strength of feeling of the people of South East Cornwall over the proposed Broadmoor Farm Development, Tuesday's Public Meeting at Saltash School could have left them in no doubt whatsoever.

The vast majority of those who attended approximately 100 individuals were vehemently opposed to this New Town proposal being foisted upon Saltash. Those few in favour, in some cases understandably, had vested interests such as the Residents of Carkeel Village complaining of the traffic passing along the A388.

That road has been an "A" Class road for decades, shutting it off as "access only" will only serve to exacerbate the already intolerable traffic flow along the A38. In truth the so-called solutions (putting in roundabouts) to the attendant




