Carkeel Congestion Urgent Action Needed

arkeel roundabout is increasingly frequently a solid am of slow or motionless traffic leading to road rage incidents and being impassable to emergency vehicles. Saltash Town Councillor and Carkeel resident John Brady called on the council for urgent action. Ambulances called out on a 'shout' are unable to proceed through to an emergency so endangering lives. Friday evenings are especially busy but complete jams are common on any day, especially during the summer.

The main problem is that traffic is unable to continue Westward where drivers. who may have travelled from London, the Midlands or the Councillor David Yates advised that there appears no solution to this as Highways England have confirmed that they have no plans to dual the road Carkeel Trerulefoot foreseeable future.

There was a plan for

duelling the road prepared when Caradon Council was in existence but this was shelved.

Plans to enlarge the roundabout and install 'smart' traffic lights should be put into effect shortly with work expected to start in the autumn. Meanwhile councillors agreed that yellow hatching close to the Texaco filling station should at least help emergency vehicles to pass through.


Up micro-businesses together, it has been a long journey'.

Meanwhile the town council is commencing proceedings to seek a compulsory purchase order for the building to proceed





Colourful Display for Churchtown **Butterfly Spotters**

f the nineteen species of British butterflies observed on the Churchtown Farm nature reserve, many were noted and identified during an August butterfly walk organised and led by the Friends of Churchtown Farm.

Around a dozen adults and children learned how to distinguish the speckled wood from the similar gatekeeper. The colourful butterfly world represented by the clouded yellow, the red admiral, the small copper and the common blue, while large white and green veined whites flew in abundance. The marbled whites which had adorned several creeekside fields had already flown as had the ringlets, but there were plenty left as budding lepidopterists of all ages focused on the flower filled meadows and looked up to the trees seeking to spot the prevalent but seldom seen purple emperors, that inhabit the tree canopy.

The walk was one of the monthly event organised through the year by the Friends of Churchtown Farm which are free to members and at a small charge to all other visitors

This is the time of year when there is no formal Cornwall Council business and we idle Councillors spend our time basking idly in the sun - not strictly true, as Planning East and Miscellaneous Licencing committees still take place and there is not much sun! This month I want to discuss specifically issues relating to the A38 and the consequences of Brexit on some EU funding programmes.

All South East Cornwall councillors are united in the view that the greatest obstacle to economic growth in the area is the state of the A38 trunk road from Carkeel to Bodmin, which is simply not fit for purpose. At present, Highways England (formerly Highways Agency) has no plans for any improvement schemes whatsoever in the five year programmes upto 2019.

With that background, three local Councillors (myself, Armand Toms from Looe and Andrew Long from Callington) were invited by MP Sheryll Murray to a meeting to lobby Transport Minister Patrick McLoughlin at Westminster early in July. We prepared a good deal of evidence for him, including details of no less than 12 dangerous locations on the A38 between Carkeel and Carminow Cross, and statistics and locations of

occasions when road traffic accidents have forced the closure of this only route to the West.

Briefly, between 2011 and 2016, the road was closed a mimimum of 5 and a maximum of 13 days per year. This year is already shaping up badly, with two A38 fatal accidents in the last fortnight. Each closure usually for a minimum of 4 hours, is estimated to cost the Cornish economy £40,000.

The meeting Westminster itself was a total waste of time I'm sorry to say. The Transport Minister was late and gave us only half an hour of his time, and that was monopolised by our MP just lobbying for the Menheniot iunction. We had no chance to even present or discuss our prepared evidence at all. And to add to the frustration, the following day McLoughlin was involved in Theresa May's first Cabinet Reshuffle. and is no longer Transport Minister!

I also want to talk about EU funding some programmes that are due to South East Cornwall, which for EU purposes extends from Saltash and Torpoint to St Austell and the Clay Country, an area of 150,000 +

I sit on the SE Local Action Group (LAG) as one of three Cornwall Councillors for the LEADER EU Funding, worth £2.1 million in agricultural

the others are grants Armand Toms from Looe and Andrew Long Callington. The voluntary members are groups and farming related groups. This scheme is now in full operation and grants up to £35k can be given to increase farm productivity or support micro businesses, rural tourism or cultural/heritage projects or forestry projects. Typical grants go to farm shops or new plant and machinery.

The bad news is that the grants are monitored by DEFRA and they have determined that the Saltash area is "urban" and not "rural". and therefore ineligible for EU LEADER grants

The other stream of EU funding, which is still at the application stage, is CLLD (Community Led Local Development) which is administered by the DCLG (Department of Communities and Local Government). It is worth £7.3 million up to 2020, and is to be focussed upon the seven areas of SE Cornwall that rank worst in

the Index of Multiple Deprivation. These include Torpoint, Callington, St Austell and the Clay Country and Saltash!!

Projects can be proposed to boost local economies and reduce dependency on Plymouth, and in Saltash, we hope to propose a scheme to re-develop the Network Rail sheds on Ashtorr Wharf for marine use and art studios and craft workshops

The CLLD Local Action Group is currently forming to submit a full proposal to DCLG this Autumn and is for additional looking members connected with the business and voluntary community as apposed to farming interests, and if from Saltash is anyone interested in joining me, please contact me afternoon meeting per month at Liskeard.

Please forgive the endless list of acronyms - Cllr Killeya would be in his element! The problem is that from previous experience over the eight years of European funding, you have to be in it to win it...

cople often say to me that there is "nothing much happening in South East Cornwall", how wrong they are. Last month I attended the South East Cornwall Workshop. There were representatives from Saltash, Looe, Torpoint and Liskeard both at Town and County Council level but also from the private sector (Chambers and private business). There were five specific areas under discussion workspace/employment land, skills, tourism, A38 and better links for Plymouth.

workspace/ employment land we discussed the need to ensure that land allocated for such use is subsequently used for it and that units to be built thereon suit the requirements that occupiers require.

However, one of the worries for the area is the lack of a skilled workforce and looking at ways to ensure that skill levels are improved.

We recognised that tourism is important to the local economy but we need to find ways to extend the tourism season and the heritage of the area was seen as means to do so. We do not have the major attractions of other areas of Cornwall, Tate Cornwall in St. Ives and Eden Project are good examples, but we do have a strong heritage and should use this to attract tourists at. otherwise, less popular times of the year.

It was recognised that Plymouth is the main player with respect to employment and we looked at ways to try and have stronger links therewith so that we can benefit from the potential opportunities that Plymouth creates.

highlighted this issue. But there are other concerns namely the poor junctions onto the A38 at Menheniot, Lean Quarry and Bodmin Parkway for example. The other issue is the chaos created in country roads when accidents occur as there are no easy diversions

All delegates were hopeful that we can achieve some short term fines in the various areas under discussion but more importantly it was felt that by pursuing matters as South East Cornwall rather than the individual communities therein we could achieve long term goals. This could have been another talking shop but there was emphatic belief that improvements can be made.

n 2014, Cornwall Council took the decision that it would no longer fund open access youth work. It was not the only local authority to cut funding for youth work: nationwide, a total of £60m in funding for youth services has been lost since 2012. The grim reality is that, along with other local authorities across the country, Cornwall Council is battling the impact of austerity and the significant cuts in funding being handed down from central government.

No - Cornwall Council was not the only authority to have cut funding to youth work, but that didn't make the bitter pill any easier to swallow. Last year, Saltash Town Council tried to ease the situation by setting up a fund of £40,000 for open access youth work and outreach work to support the young people within our town. We are nearing the end of that tranche of funding, and reports from The Core (formerly K3), Groundwork and Livewire (the 3 recipients) say the money has made a big difference, but personally I feel that the only reason that local youth projects have been able to carry on with their vital work is because of the dedication, passion and vision of their leaders and volunteers. So before giving you a few examples of how the funding has been used, I would just like to say how grateful Saltash Town Council is to all those involved in bolstering the wellbeing of young people in our town - thanks to the leaders and volunteers in the Girlguiding and Scouting

well as the youth projects.

So, the Town Council

funding has enabled the team

at The Core to offer, for

example, a weekly junior club for 11-14 year olds, a weekly senior club for 14-18 years olds, awareness programmes about bullying, drugs and sexual health as well as support for the TIC TAC lunchtime sessions Saltash.net. Over at Livewire, the funding from the Town Council has helped the team offer open access sessions, deliver a project for NEETs, offer one-to-one support work for young people referred by social workers from Cornwall's CHIN team, and awareness programmes about internet safety, drugs, racism and dealing with stress. In both youth projects, the funding from the Saltash Town Council has helped to unlock funding from other

It is harder to measure the impact the funding has had on the self-esteem of young people, but last month I went along to the Livewire AGM as well as the Open Day and Fun Run held at The Core, and meeting young people on these occasions I was forcibly struck by the positive impact the

youth projects are having. The young people there were clearly feeling more confident about their future. At The Core, I was also forcibly struck by the mayoral chain of office when I joined in the warm-up exercises before the Fun Run, but that's another story..

I'm mentioning all this now for two reasons: one is so that you can join me in celebrating the positive outcomes these projects are delivering for our young people; the other is because Saltash Town Council has decided to set up another fund of £40,000 for the provision of youth work services from September this year. Do you know an organisation that could hold outreach sessions? Or could support young people in need help? Then get that organisation to contact the Guildhall for more details about the funding on offer. The details are also available on the Saltash Town Council website: www.saltash.gov.uk. deadline for submitting bid proposals is noon on Monday 5th September.



Tales That Got Awav...

As promised during the twenty fifth year of bringing you tales of Saltash, we are also looking back at some of the intriguing stories that have never quite made it to our pages.

When we attended the grand re-opening of the Belle $\it Vue Rd$ premises that are now the home of our Community Interest Company, we came upon a fascinating little local tale that we thought we ought to share.

The Belle Vue Road Blitz and A True Life Aga Saga

The re-opening of the Belle Vue Road premises which are now a home for the town's Community Interest Company the Citizens Advice Bureau, Food Bank, and various other local public and commercial enterprises brought back memories to Michael Lavelle who was born and brought up in the premises.

His father had the house and his adjacent dental surgery built in the 1930's but the house was short -lived. On 28th April 1941 Saltash was a target for the Luftwaffe and Michael well remembers being in the house as it came crashing down in flames before his older brother, then aged just 15, drove his mother and siblings to Notter Bridge, one of the several temporary homes they would inhabit before the house was rebuilt in 1947.

The family kept pigs, chickens and cows in the extensive garden now covered by a car park. A photograph shows hens pecking over the ruins and Michael well remembers one of his childhood chores as driving the two small but sturdy Kerry cows down Fore Street and through the side gate into the back garden.

One of his most vivid early memories however is of the huge Aga oven into which his mother placed the porridge each evening to simmer gently ready for the next morning's breakfast.

As the roof and walls crashed down in flames during the raid in 1941 the Aga dropped through the floor into the basement. There it stood, covered in rubble until the rebuilding in 1947, when it was uncovered, opened and the porridge still stood moist and apparently edible.

The Lavelles' did not risk sampling the six year old porridge but did inform the AGA manufacturers who donated to them a new AGA cooker free of charge for their post-war porridge.

Essa Files

Coming to us from New Zealand

wrote my last column from Australia and although I'm now back in Cornwall, in between I had ten days exploring New Zealand. Those of you who have seen the 'Lords of the Rings' films will be very familiar with its huge scenic charms, which are far from its only appeal. During my time there I got to see a huge geyser erupt right in front of me, took a train journey across the (Southern) Alps, stepped off a tall building (Auckland 'Sky Jump' if you want to look it up), and got elected as a 'Chief' for a visit to a Maori Village.

In addition I went to a lot of museums. I always like learning new things and find that I discover far more about the history and culture of a new country by pottering around their museums than I ever could from a guide book. In New Zealand I found three particularly common themes in their museums - in reverse order earthquakes; Maori history & culture; and Gallipoli.

As many of you will know the Gallipoli campaign of 1915 was one of the First World War's military unmitigated disasters. Intended to give a quick boost to the Allied cause it turned into eight months of bloody fighting leaving about 120,000 dead nothing actually changed: the only aspect of it that was militarily successful was the evacuation.

I visited at three major Gallipoli exhibitions in New Zealand and one in Australia; and went to the Last Post ceremony at both national war memorials. Although 'only' 3,000 of the dead was Zealanders psychological impact on both

New Zealand and Australia (just under 9,000 dead) was huge, since the Australia and New Zealand Army Corps, the famous ANZACs, were the heart of the fighting. Both countries lost more men on the Somme, but it is Gallipoli that really sticks in their national consciousness perhaps because it came first, perhaps because it was so ultimately pointless.

All of which puts two particularly important points in my head which apply to Saltash as much Australia and New Zealand. Firstly, the critical importance of remembering sacrifices the made. especially during this centenary period but also beyond as fewer and fewer veterans of the second world war survive to remind us themselves. Secondly the fundamental important of promoting peace in all that we do - in how we approach other countries and in how we approach each other, to reduce the chances that such pointless wholescale slaughter will ever happen again.

Advanced Level Results 2016 saltash.net Community School



here was much to celebrate at saltash.net community school when students arrived on the morning of Thursday August 18th to collect their long awaited A Level and AS Level results. The months of hard work and effort had definitely paid off with almost 50% of all grades achieved at A Level being A*, A and B. With a cohort of 98 students, making it one of the largest A Level groups across schools in Cornwall, these results demonstrate the ongoing success of post 16 provision at saltash.net. Very pleasingly, alongside the very high proportion of top grades, the average points score per student also increased in 2016, reflecting excellent progress across the entire ability range.

There were many outstanding individual performances, including those of the school's Head Student team for 2015-16. Between them, Georgina Curtis, Paul Gerry, Ellen Hambly and Hannah Paull clocked up a remarkable $4\,A*s$, $4\,As$ and 5Bs, whilst at the same time having made an exemplary contribution to the school and local community throughout their time at saltash.net.

Also deserving of special individual praise was Ellie Spencer who faced extreme adversity throughout the duration of her A Levels, which included her ongoing battle with the cancer she was diagnosed with during her GCSEs. Despite everything, Ellie still managed to secure an A* grade in Psychology, an A grade in Sociology, B grades in Maths and Biology and an A* for her Extended Project Qualification.

These superb results now mean that the majority of students are able to progress to their first choice universities or apprenticeships, which include the prestigious Glasgow School of Art for Molly Stubbs, a place at London University (Royal Holloway) to study Film, Television and Media Production for Georgina Curtis, Exeter University's Mathematics with International Study for Matt Seymour and Law with French at Bristol University for Ellen Hambly. For Gabriel Crocombe, who secured three B grades in Maths, Further Maths and Physics, a place to study Maths with Education awaits at the highly regarded Texas A & M University in the United States of America.

For Year 12 students collecting their results, there was also a great deal to celebrate with more outstanding achievements, including those of Ed Gilford who, alongside attaining A grades in Further Maths, Physics and Chemistry and an A* in the Extended Project, also managed to gain an A* in A Level Maths a year early, with a terrific final result of 594 marks out of 600 across all of his papers.

Head of Sixth Form, Adam Killeya, praised all of the outcomes, saying, 'We are really proud of what the students have achieved with the strong support of their teachers, family and friends: their hard work really has paid off.'

Inevitably, for staff and students at saltash.net, this year's A Level Results were tinged with sadness and poignancy following the tragic death of year 13 student, Charlie Pitcher, back in July. Speaking on results' day, Headteacher, Isobel Bryce, said, 'The whole school community continues to be greatly saddened by Charlie's untimely death. I am certain, however, that his family will be feeling an element of pride today knowing that Charlie was among the school's top performers, gaining, alongside other very good results, an A grade in Maths, the subject he was most passionate about.'

In tribute to Charlie, a group of year 13 students who are part of a band called Helvellyn will be playing a concert in his memory at a local pub on results' day night.
